Blankenburg Elementary School GOALS

Math GOALS:

- At least 7.6% of grades 3-8 students will score proficient/advanced on the ELA PSSA

Reading GOALS:

- At least 45% of K-3 scholars will score at Tier 1 Target on the STAR test.
- At least 17.4% of grade 3-8 students will score proficient/advanced on the ELA PSSA.
- At least 10% of grade 3 students will score proficient/advanced on the ELA PSSA

Climate GOALS:

- At least 35% of all students will attend 95% of school days.
- At least 93% of students will have 0 out of school suspensions.

Acceleration Network Academic Focus:

- To ensure that each student has access to grade level text, curriculum, standards, and instruction on a daily basis.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together:

SCHOOL/TEACHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

Blankenburg Elementary School will:

- Hold a meeting with parents and building representatives to review the School-wide plan, School Parent Compact Parent and Parent and Family Engagement Policy and agree on the plan.
- Report Card Conferences will be offered three (3) times a year. Interim reports will also be provided to parents regarding their child's progress.
- Hold Kindergarten Open House for new families in March and May.
- Our School Improvement Support Liaison is always available to facilitate conversations between our staff and Blankenburg families.
- Blankenburg Elementary School employs an "Open door" policy and parents are always welcome to discuss their child with administration and our faculty. Parents and caregivers are encouraged to make an appointment with teachers so the class does not experience an interruption in instruction. Teachers are available during preparation periods, before or after school with an appointment.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Monitor attendance.
- Supply absent notes in a timely manner.
- Make sure that homework is complete.
- Monitor the amount of television my child watches.
- Screen time on electronic devices
- Volunteer in my child's classroom.
- Participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education.
- Promote positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Stay informed about my child's education and communicate with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.
- Serve, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as the School Advisory Council (SAC).
- Ensure that our child will adhere to all school policies.
- Make sure all contact information is up to date.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Follow schoolwide PBIS expectations.
- Do my homework every day and ask for help when I need it.
- Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.
- Give to my parents or the adult who is responsible for my welfare all notices and information received by me from my school every day.
- All Kindergarten students and parents will participate in the 100 Book Challenge.
- Adhere to all school policies.
